Dispose for Health

Go through your pharmacy and discard all the out-of-date medication. Dispose of the never-to-be-used samples of soap and creams. Keep your side of the vanity as bare as possible and colour-coordinate your soap, shampoo and towels.

Empty for Love - IF YOU ARE SINGLE

The Sheltermaking Imperative by Peter Cowman

Speaker @ 2008 Feng Shui Conference

By changing the way we look at the subject of human shelter we gain the potential to change our lives. It is the incorporation within a home of the ability to change and adapt that offers us the power to change not only ourselves but, in consequence, the world. It is the need for such change that characterises all proposed solutions to the problems of climate change and environmental breakdown. The reason that house design wields such power is simple. Settled life is the basis of civilisation as we know it. Houses are the cornerstone of settled life, and, in consequence, underpin all the civilised values we revere.

This vital role that housing plays in civilised life is clearly reflected in the economic structure of the world where special status is ascribed to houses. Where virtually all other commodities fall in value after purchase, the opposite is true of houses which normally increase in value over the course of their lifetimes. This trick of accounting is a key component of the market led economic system that now shrouds the globe.

The special status that houses and property enjoy is forged by linking the work we do to the shelter we need to survive. By treating our working time as a commodity

the economic value of our labour over a specified period can be quantified. By allowing one to borrow against the projected value of this work and to use these borrowings to invest in a place to live, the 'worker' is tied to his or her job because he or she must repay from it the cost of the shelter that is essential to their survival.

The work/shelter cycle, as long as it satisfies people and their desire to live, is a miracle of progress. However when this cycle grows to depend on factors that are beyond the needs of people they become hostages to economic forces that have nothing to do with them or the life of the planet. This is the situation in the developed world at the present time. Economic growth is everything. This favours increased consumption and the application of market-driven solutions to the resultant woes. Because business is normally bottom-line driven and head-centred, the consequences of unbridled economic growth is often threatening to life on the planet. Solving these problems in a market led economy will, it is imagined, further assist economic growth!

Because houses form a vital part of economic systems, which are normally wholly focussed on commercial values, any change in the established work/shelter

cycle is strongly resisted. This blocks progress in terms of developing imaginative and adaptable house designs. It also renders much of the existing housing stock vulnerable to a crisis such as a fossil fuel drought. In such a situation many existing homes will become uninhabitable.

To avoid such physical and emotional trauma we must people must begin re-engaging with the house design process. Whether a new building is being created or an existing one renovated, this re-establishment of the 'sheltermaking imperative' allows people to connect to life in a deep and meaningful way. This encourages us to see our homes as an extension of our selves. By such means we gain the power to change our way of life, re-connecting to the intangibles that are beyond rational and the machinations of the market economy.

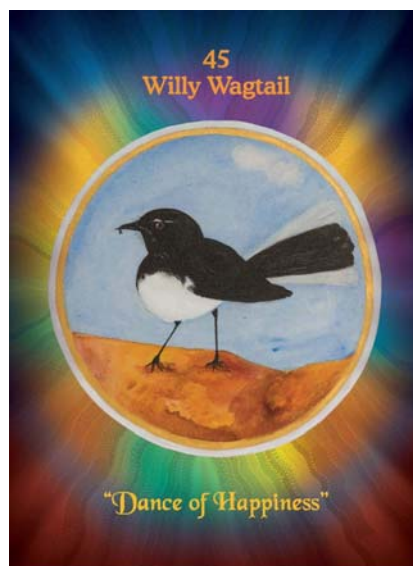
Black in colour with a white chest and white specks over his eyes, Willy Wagtail is a tiny symbol of joy. Standing approximately 100mm, you will be graced with his presence in most areas of this ancient continent. For such a tiny specimen, he displays an awesome presence. He eagerly dances and pivots his tail feathers back and forth, calling you to focus in the moment, mesmerising you to join him in his dance of joy, right here and right now!

Willy Wagtail appears fearless. Neither man nor beast bothers this jovial dancing bird. He happily runs up and down a bovine's back snaring the insects that may sting or bite his host. He will dart between their massive feet to snatch up insects as they are flushed out in grazing pastures. If you take your family into the great outdoors, Willy will be there doing his happy dance, no matter where or when, and he will offer you the gift of joy if you tune into his present moment.

Willy Wagtail skilfully constructs a tiny cup shaped nest to raise his family. He builds it from spider web and animal hair or anything fine and delicate that he discovers during his day. He will choose a sheltered place, under the cover of a veranda or perhaps on a bearer under your house. He may even choose to build on the backyard Hills Hoist and happily sail the breeze as he runs countless devoted errands to bring back insects that will feed his demanding fledglings.

It would be hard to perceive that any man could do harm to this tiny ambassador of happiness and presence. Willy has mastered the law of attraction; he understands what you fear most will be drawn to you in order to learn peace. "Have no fear and there will be nothing to fear" he smiles. 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Divining the Dreaming by Alanna Moore © 2008

As a geomancer I love to delve into the energetic aspects of landscape. It is particularly fascinating to study its mythic qualities, the dimensions of the Dreaming, to use Aboriginal terminology. The Dreaming, or Dreamtime, is not some extinct memory of quaint folklore, of merely entertaining or 'superstitious' place stories. Where landscapes are fairly intact, it is still a dynamic element that conveys the character of a place, forged from its eco-spiritual, energetic, topographic, geological and historic dimensions. Dowsing, or divining, is a means of discovering the subtle Dreaming nature of place, as is meditation at key points in the landscape. Both approaches can help us to forge a deep connection to the environment.

The concept of the Dreaming maintains the understanding that all life is imbued with consciousness and that this is available for our perceptions to interact with. Buddhism also asserts this view, as do the paradigms of indigenous, animistic cultures worldwide, from the Shinto traditions of Japan to the fairy lore of Ireland; while the Aboriginal deep connection to place has remained intact over the longest continuum. Unfortunately this view has been globally suppressed by imperialistic religions over the best part of the last two millennia. However, despite this, it has also remained ingrained in peoples' psyches and can be pieced together

from a survey of fragmentary legends and by visiting sites for direct experiential studies. As the Dreamtime is a concept conveying the timeless other-dimensional qualities of place, it is a term usefully employed to help us recapture those ancient understandings anywhere and everywhere. The Earth spirit is alive and it's waiting for us to tap into it!

St Patrick was supposed to have banished the serpents of Ireland. But Ireland did not harbour any physical snakes and my dowsing studies have discovered the vital serpent forces of the land to be alive and well there, as they are in Australia. Serpentine energy flows provide pathways for the 'little people', the nature beings, to travel along and many an Irish fairy story tells of the dire consequences if one obstructs them in any way! Around the world such concepts have been sidelined by property developers with the pressure of population increase and the rise of capitalism giving greater credence to monetary values.

Yet we can still enjoy the magical value of the land and live in harmony with it, if we re-awaken to and respect its Dreaming qualities. By connecting to the intelligence of place, by allowing it to speak to us, rather than just imposing our will upon it, we can co-create a better world for all. When we act this way, I have found myself, the harmony

flows, obstructions dissolve, relationships prosper and life is filled with serendipity. In a modern world filled with all kinds of stress, conflicts, tragedy and want, we can create our own havens of balance and backyard bliss. And by recapturing the essence of the Dreaming together with an eco-spiritual approach that respects the rights of nature, we can forge a deeply meaningful way of life, in the process helping to ensure the survival of life on planet Earth.

Bio – Author Alanna Moore has been a professional geomancer for 25 years and has travelled extensively



across Australia and New Zealand researching and teaching, and more recently across Europe. She is the author of five books and has made 19 films, mostly on dowsing and geomancy. Since 2000 she has been visiting Ireland, discovering the Dreaming of the land of her ancestors and she now spends each northern summer there, with her husband, Irish eco-architect Peter Cowman, in rural County Leitrim. There she has been researching her 'Leitrim Dreaming Project', on which she will report in her conference presentation.

Supporting Indigenous Community in the far north

Recently I was blessed with being invited to a very remote aboriginal community 2 hours from Cooktown. This wonderful community is a alcohol and drug free community and is setting an example for other communities. The land has been given back to its indigenous caretakers. The journey there was by 4 wheel drive access only and the access was only possible because it is the dry season at present. During the wet season it is very difficult to get in or out of this land as there are many creeks to go through, and I mean through!, not over! No bridges up that way!

On arrival to the land a welcome ceremony was performed. My friend, who is one of the caretakers of the land performed a smoke ceremony. He called to the spirit of the land to say that he had brought me here and that I was a friend and to welcome me to the land and keep me protected. He told me the land is the boss! "Land gets to decide who stays".



I then travelled over many more creeks into the scrub and rainforest country. On this land I experienced the power of nature like never before. I became one with the earth. I could feel her heartbeat as I slept on the earth, I bathed in the pure flowing creeks. The dingoes howled outside my tent during the night. I watched in amazement a spectacular show of the lights in the heavenly galaxy every night. I visited sacred women's sites and was shown bush tucker and the most powerful experience was my Owl Medicine Initiation. Life will never be the same again!

Kuku Yalanji people have lived at Bura (China Camp) for thousands of years. In Yalanji language Buru means "bowl", because Bura country is shaped like a bowl, with the mountains around the rim and the creeks running through the middle.

White people first came to Buru about 100 years ago. They found tin at Buru – and for a while there were big mining camps with lots of European and Chinese miners. That's how Buru got the name China Camp.
